FREEMAN FARM

The Bourne Conservation Trust has just signed a purchase agreement with the South Sagamore Water District for a beautiful tract of land. The parcel is about eleven acres and is located on the Sandwich/Bourne border in South Sagamore. Formerly part of the historic Freeman family farm, the land includes trails that give access to the Cape Cod Canal and a large open space that for centuries had been a hay field.

Edmund Freeman developed the land under terms of a grant he received in 1637. His original home was across the Manomet River (the course of the present canal) in West Sandwich, now Sagamore Heights. When Freeman's wife, Liz, died, he chose a spot on a knoll looking out over the farm for her burial place. Because they had traveled to church services on the same horse—he on the saddle, she more primly on the pillion behind the saddle—he set a pillion-shaped marker on her grave and had a saddle-shaped stone prepared for his. These stones are still in place on the hill behind the Snow Goose Shop at the junction of Tupper Road and Route 6A. Bronze plaques memorialize the couple in a well tended plot at the site.

Descendants of the Freeman family rebuilt the farmhouse in

1800 not far from the parcel being purchased by the BCT. The house and barns were considered to be among the most authentically preserved examples of that era. The farm continued to be a working hay farm with a small herd of dairy cattle until the early 1950s. Regrettably, the buildings were completely destroyed in 1983 in a fire of

suspicious origin two days before negotiations were to begin to have them relocated for historic preservation.

Bourne Selectmen walk the boundaries of the town every three years and, in doing so, they pace the edge of this parcel which represents the easternmost border of the Bourne line on the south side of the canal. An historic way, Freeman's Lane (east of the Sagamore Inn), constitutes this boundary and is still well trod by walkers who have enjoyed the natural beauty of this land which will soon, thanks to the benefactors of the Bourne Conservation Trust, be forever in trust as open space.

(The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection must give approval to the sale of the South Sagamore Water District land. A June closing is anticipated.)

This trail leads through a wooded portion of the Freeman Farm property, opening into a field.



MAKE “NEXT TIME” “THIS TIME”

Next time you're at the junction of the County and Shore roads, take an admiring look at the handsome repointing of the stone wall that borders a BCT property. Next time you have an urge to make a tax

deductible donation, remember that the BCT is looking for \$100,000, the cost of the acreage soon to be purchased from the South Sagamore Water District—11-plus wooded acres between Route 6A and the canal. Next time you're driving north (or south) on Route 28A, slow down, look east, so you can get a good look at the 2.5 acres retained by the BCT after the sale of “Cataumet

Crossing” (house and single acre), the \$400,000 proceeds from the sale plus private

donations made it possible to pay off the mortgage quite early. Next time you're driving down Valley Bars Road past the BCT's Little Bay property, glance to your left and check out the Town of Bourne property where BCT volunteers are hacking loop trails, this with the Bourne Conservation Commission's unanimous blessing. Next time you again feel generous, keep in mind that the BCT needs a \$1,000,000 + endowment for a fund to assure property maintenance and future property purchases. And next time you have the urge to own a couple of small cabins on two acres—for example those that the BCT owned briefly at Briarwood, be advised that the Dexter School got there before you with \$230,000.

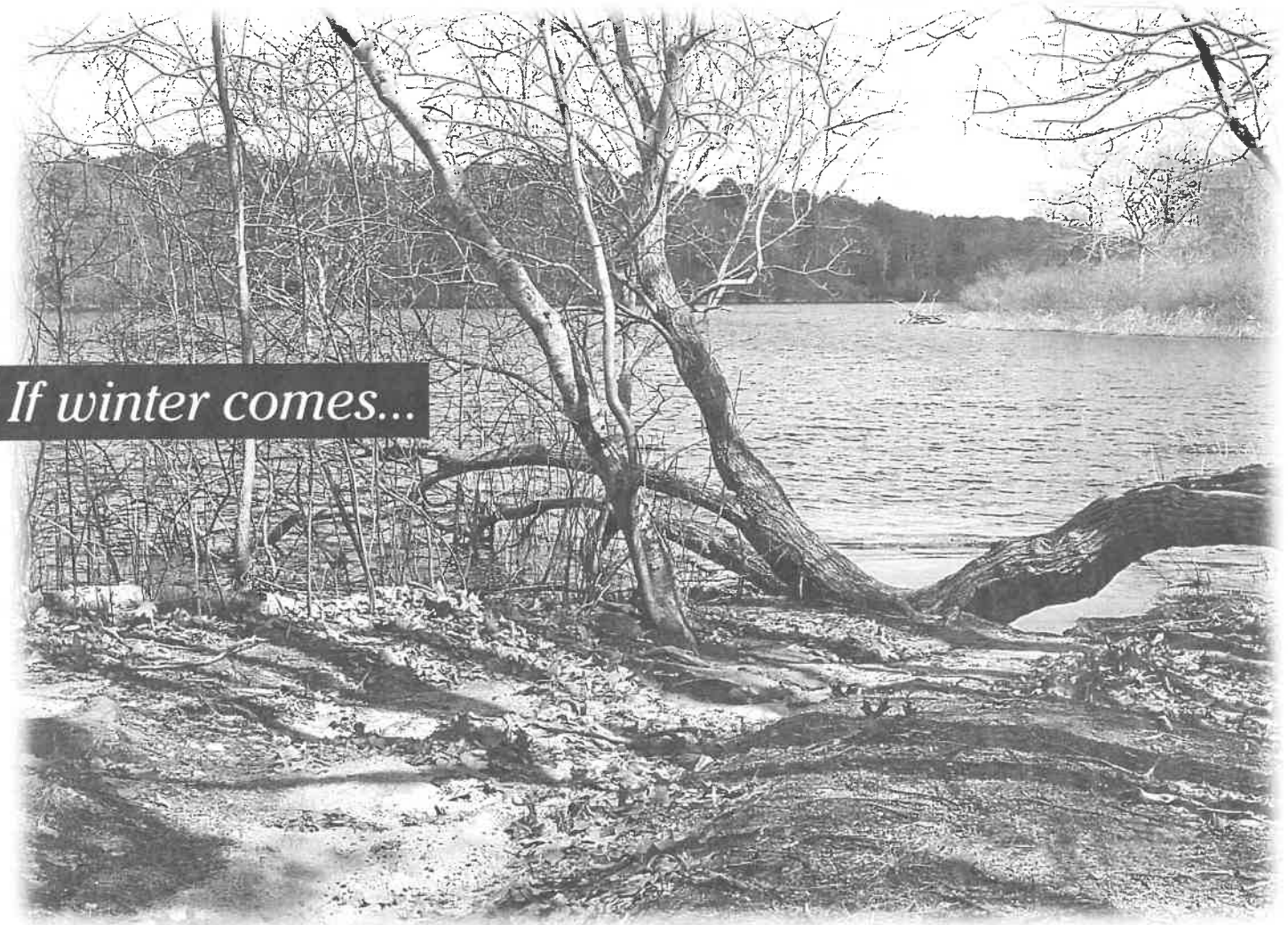

out possible conning perches while a lone great blue heron takes a leisurely early morning stroll across the south-shore peninsula which the female swan seems to be casing as a likely nesting site. Earlier in the month, the swan pair deserted their iced-over home

finding a meal below the Pond's wrinkled summertime surface. Regulars—gulls, mallards, black ducks watch—and keep their distance—from Canada geese whose visit will be cut short by a hissing and snorting 'mute' swan, and invading, home-seeking swans

stay-at-homes—cardinals, sparrows, jays, chickadees, finches, woodpeckers and just arrived robins go about their business. All of this hustle and bustle once again raises the poet's question: **“Can spring be far behind?”** Answer: Don't hold your breath.

BCT Christmas Trees

The spirit of Christmas was alive and well in Cataumet last December when David and Freddie Dimmick opened their County Road property to one day of live Christmas tree cutting.

Families who purchased a tree were treated to a tractor ride and a holiday reception. Around the decorated Christmas tree in the barn, they enjoyed music, holiday snacks, and good conversation. By selling trees for \$30 each, the Dimmicks raised as much as \$900 for the Bourne Conservation Trust, while providing a warm holiday experience for 30 families.

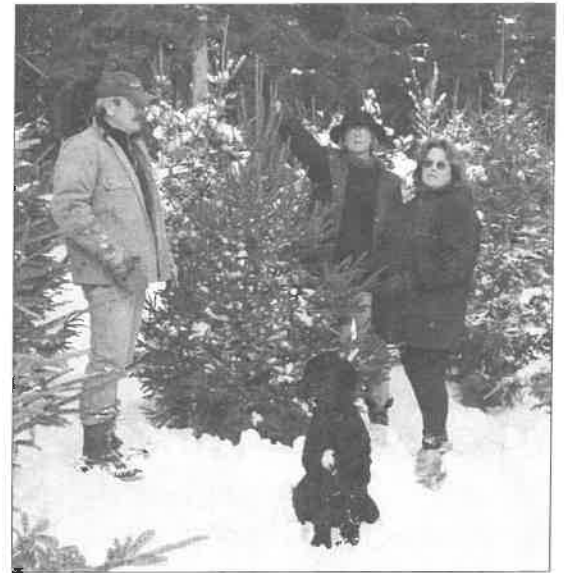
Tod Dimmick, who, with his wife Jennifer and their two young sons, Spencer and Kurt, was on hand to help his parents with the event, said his family had planted more than 100 balsam fir and white spruce trees on the land six years ago, as part of a forestry woodlot project. The Christmas tree lot is adjacent to their Tree Farm, where the family has planted more than 3,000 white pine seedlings. By last December, the Christmas trees were large enough to be harvested.

"That was when my dad came up with the idea of selling them to

benefit the Bourne Conservation Trust," said Tod. "At that time, we came up with the two objectives. We wanted to raise some money and put on an event to bring the whole community together." The day of the tree cutting was beautiful and sunny. David Dimmick hooked up his 1956 International Harvester tractor to his stake-sided flatbed trailer, threw on some hay bales for seating, got out the saws, and waited for the people to arrive. Nature had delivered a new coating of snow the night before, which brightened the day and would later entice children of all ages to throw a few snowballs and build snowmen.

The people needed little publicity to draw them to the

farm. The Dimmicks had erected just one small sign on the road announcing the cutting, and let word-of-mouth do the rest. At the end of the day, 30 families had dropped by to drink some Christmas cider, learn a bit about the Bourne Conservation Trust, and pick the perfect Christmas tree.

"More than one person said to me that theirs was the most magical Christmas tree they had ever found," said Tod.

He noted that one person who had just purchased a Christmas tree elsewhere came by the farm, saw the sign, and turned right around and returned her tree. She immediately came to the Dimmicks to cut down her perfect tree.

Next year, the Dimmicks plan to do it all again.

"We have enough trees," said Tod. "Even if it is twice as popular next year we will be all right. But if it is more than twice as popular, we will have to grow some more trees."

Winter Fun Run

It was a beautiful sunny day on Sunday, January 5, as 141 registered for the 23rd annual Winter Fun Run sponsored by the Cape Cod Road Runners. Runners as young as 11 and as old as 69 ran the 4.9-mile course along the roads of Monument Beach. An award ceremony featuring seafood chowder and fritters was held afterwards at the Weary Travelers Masonic Club on Valley Bars Road, the starting and ending point for the race.

Robert G. Burt of Pocasset, director for the race and longtime member of the Cape Cod Road Runners, was on hand to wish the runners well as they took off from the starting line at 10:30 AM. Fellow road runner and Bourne Conservation Trust President Stephen Ballentine of Cataumet led the pack of runners through the course, riding in a borrowed, bright red convertible Corvette.

Mr. Burt noted the annual Winter Fun Run is truly a race for runners, held at a time when there are few opportunities to get out and run

with other people. He said the low entry fee, the food, free giveaway of cotton gloves, and the quick production of race results are all part of creating a perfect event for runners. Raising money for the Bourne Conservation Trust is an added bonus, he said, but is not the primary reason for the race.

Kendall G. Jones of Bourne Village, a Weary Traveler Club member and former merchant mariner, was hard at work stirring a gigantic pot of chowder in the Weary Traveler's kitchen at 9 that morning. Mr. Jones said he made the 15 gallons of chowder himself, starting work at 5 AM. The hot

chowder was made from quahogs, cod, flounder and fluke caught fresh for the event. He noted fellow masons Michael Wrighter and Clifford R. Jones were responsible for the fritters.

The race raised \$469 for the Bourne Conservation Trust.

Thomas S. Cahir of Pocasset, charter member of the Cape Road Runners who ran in the race, said it was a great day to be running, but noted the difficulty of keeping up with some of the younger, more energetic runners. "It doesn't get any easier," he joked as he crossed the finish line.

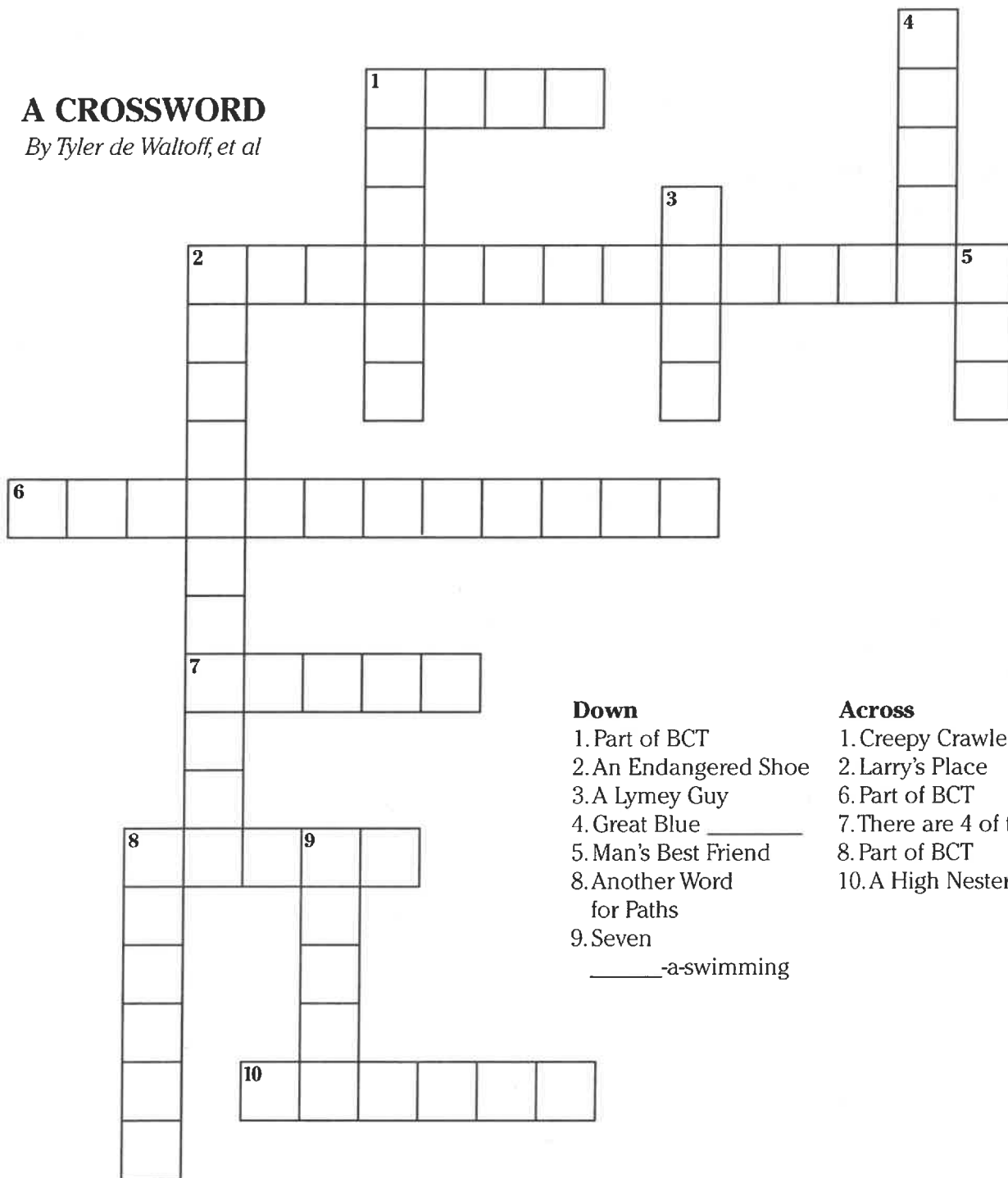

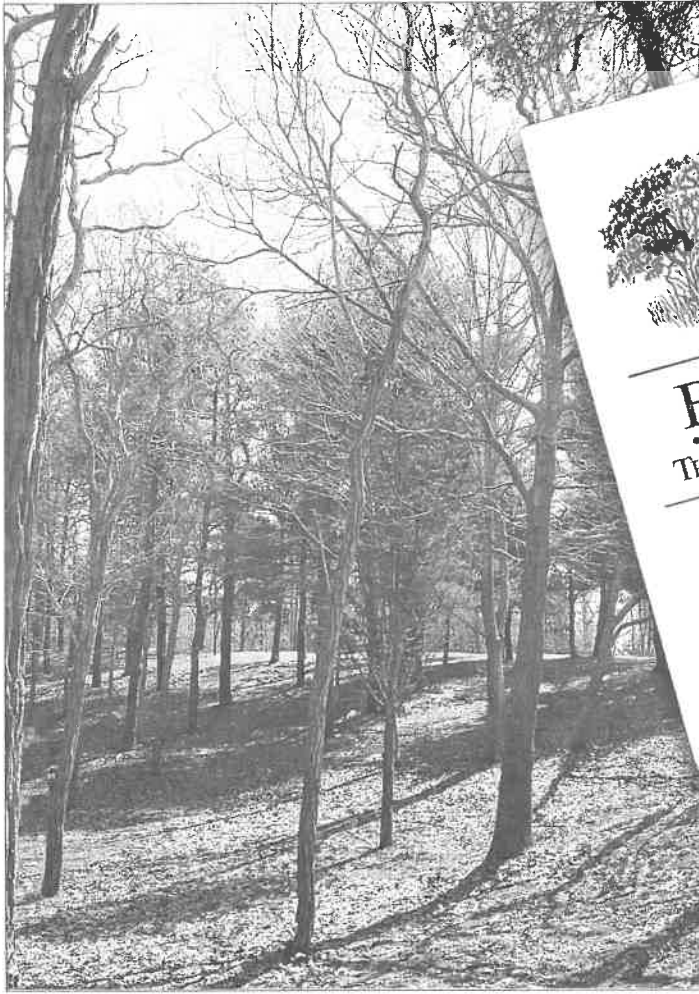
