


In the spring along the Pond's eastern shore, the lower branches of maples and beeches arc out over the water in a leafy canopy that shelters a series of cool, dank niches. Inside each of these mini-grottoes sits a winter-weary bullfrog waiting--patient and alone--among the water weeds, submerged except for his head, his eyes glittering in anticipation. He's waiting for weather warm enough to entice him into announcing his presence to the world by uncorking a basso-profundo mating call. Finally, late in May, he finds his voice and by early June his song is blending with

others in a crescendo of passionate, earsplitting *jug-o'-rums*. By the eve of Hurricane Bob, along with his brothers and cousins, he was singing up a storm.

And what an offbeat howler Hurricane Bob turned out to be, lacquering the Pond's surface with skittering suds above which, diving and swooping like World War I fighter planes, a squadron of swallows put on a madcap display of aerial acrobatics. Rowdy, salt-laden wind knocked down a half dozen trees--scrub oaks, willows, swamp maples--and snapped off dozens of branches, then pitched them into the shallows as it seasoned every leaf in its path. Tangled mats of reedy bottom grass surfaced to become floating, wind-driven islets, while the raucous grackle mafia that had been bullying the Pond's usual bird population since early April vanished unmourned.

Hours later, after the wind abated and the whitecaps flattened, birds--jays, chickadees, orioles, nuthatches, cardinals--appeared from nowhere to reclaim their bruised and abandoned trees and shrubs. Snugly cradled aboard the new green islets, dozens of basking painted turtles rocked to the Pond's subdued motion. Maples and loosestrife along the shore, bamboozled by Bob's antics into believing that they'd found a shortcut to April, put out new leaves. Waterfowl emerged: from the

sheltering reeds in the northeast quarter the aloof swan couple, then a mother mallard trailed by a half dozen ducklings in a blur of shrill peeps and inept quacks. Four great blue herons floated out of salt singed northshore oaks where they'd hunkered down. Competing mallard drakes shadowed a female with springlike intent. A pair of kingfishers crisscrossed the Pond to check out their conning trees. High above a squealing osprey circled, but from the bullfrog grottoes there was only silence.

From afar, these: "Thanks so much for the work you do. The newsletter is great (and) warmed the cockles of my homesick heart" and "thanks for all your hard and valuable work!" And from even more remotely afar, this: "Here's my bit toward the good work. Keep it up." We will.

...us!...we!...whatever! Our double-your-money grant offer of \$75,000 has been extended to the year's end. We have thus far matched \$50,000 of that grant, so \$25,000 remains to match your efforts, dollar for dollar.

As of 31 October, of the \$1.3 million needed, we have raised:

1990 - 359,750.07

1991 - 112,974.17

Total - \$810,616.29



You ask, and how many people have contributed? Noodle this: in 1990, our donors numbered 490; in 1991, 448. We had hoped to record 1,000 donors this year and while this shortfall has not made us actually disgruntled, still we are far from gruntled. 
Examples of an appropriate format for such gift-giving are:

One of Kahlin's favorite fall activites was making an Advent Garden. Whenever she walked in the woods or along the shore, she collected small souvenirs for her garden. She kept them in a box until the Advent Season, the four weeks just before Christmas. An activity like this is fun for grandparents and parents to do with children. This Advent Garden is made up of four natural groups. Week I, minerals: things such as sand, pebbles, small crystals and even shells, although some may insist that shells belong to the animal world. Week II, plants: moss, house plants, greens, twigs to represent trees, and so on. Week III, animals: miniature animals made of wood, metal, glass or other natural materials. No plastic! Week IV, people: dolls or human figures made of natural materials such as wool or cotton cloth, corn husks, or wood, for example. A simple table covered with a cloth may be used and it should be in an everyday location. For those who light candles, it is a beautiful addition to an already meaningful tradition.

The exacting task of making an Advent Garden offers a wonderful opportunity for parents and grandparents to discuss man's relationship with and responsibility for the natural environment.

Kahlin's Korner is a regular feature of the Newsletter, featuring children's articles or drawings about na-

ture. Included will be activites that are fun and will also help children to understand their natural environment. We hope you will submit ideas for future issues. (BCT, Box 203, Cataumet MA 02534)
