Thinking “Green” in Bourne

In many cultures over the centuries the color green has symbolized hope. Anyone who has survived a New England winter can easily understand why green and hope have been connected. The first green buds appearing on trees and shrubs lift our spirits, and thoughts of the lushness and warmth of summer are indicators of the fulfillment of our hopes and expectations.

Whether we are ‘rounders or summer residents, we are fortunate to spend time on this fragile neck, surrounded by the sea, a tidal river and a lovely bay. It is a place we’ve chosen, and the nature that surrounds us provides gifts for all our senses. Swimming, boating, fishing, walking—wherever we are on the Cape, there are many varieties of trees, shrubs, flowers, sea life and birdsong, and

often the squeals and laughter of children! The summer sky caps it all, and the sunsets are truly magical.

Storms and changing conditions can affect our area dramatically. Beach and embankment changes have been observed; therefore, communities on the Cape are making efforts to plant dune grass and keep up with proper practices.

Sharing ideas, techniques (such as rain gardens, composting, or water barrels) and getting advice from outside experts or through the successes and/or failures of others can make a difference for us all.

They say, “It takes a village to raise a child.” Perhaps it takes concerned and caring individuals as well as organizations like the Bourne Conservation Trust to sustain a healthy environment for the present and to ensure the best possible future for generations to come.

It Takes a Village

Throughout our community, small groups of people have banded together to host special fundraisers in support of the BCT. Here are examples of four events that resulted in more than \$8,170 in contributions to our organization.

True Old-Fashioned Barn Sale

There is something special about exploring an old barn like the one owned by Grace Rowe and Hal DeWaltoff. And when the barn is full of wonderful “objects d’art” that are for sale, that’s even better. The event held last summer was in memory of Ann Zevin, a favorite aunt of Jane Downing. Annie, as she was called, loved the Cape and was a long-time supporter of the BCT. As executor of her estate, Jane decided to organize this Barn Sale and sell many of the wonderful items from Annie’s house to raise money for the BCT. It wasn’t easy as all the items had to be packed and shipped from Somerville. When combined with some other items (home furnishings, fashion accessories, sports equipment and even a little junk) donated by Jane and Howard Crow and Grace and Hal, the event raised more than \$1,400 to be donated to the BCT in memory of Annie. The event was hard work and took a lot of time, but everyone (organizers and shoppers alike) had a grand time.

“Maintain the Critters at the Farm” Barn Sale

In the fall, BCT supporters held a Barn Sale at Spring Hill Farm to raise money to help offset the cost of caring for the senior residents of the farm, Finny the horse and Ben and Peter, two very personable goats. Ben, Peter and Finny are

long-time residents at the Farm and featured guests of the Cataumet Civic Associates annual East Egg Hunt.

The sale items, which included gently used clothes, bikes, chairs, Christmas decorations, small household items, pet supplies including dog leashes made from retired halyards, old books and best sellers, and countless other treasures, were set up in the barn for all to see.

Early birds were allowed in but had to pay double the marked price (one person did). Hot seller: There was a bidding war for foul weather pants marked for \$2...they sold for \$4.



The sale of items and special donations raised \$1,900 to help offset the care of the animals (hay, grain, bedding, farrier and vet fees), which is estimated to be around \$4,000/year. Another Barn (yard) Sale to support the critters is being held (May 29) while this newsletter is being printed.

The Secrets of Indian Cooking

Surendra Shah learned the secrets of Indian cooking from his mother while growing up in Kenya. Jane Downing loves to cook and wanted to know more about Indian cooking. Put these two together and you have the start of something big. With Jane at his side, Surendra

cooked one night and most of the next day. These two, along with Alice DeNormandie and Howard Crow, then hosted a dinner party at Jane and Howard’s house for 18 guests and BCT supporters. The menu: tandori chicken, vegetarian curry, three chutneys, nan, and basmati rice with almonds. The reviews: rave. Even better, more than \$3,000 was donated to the BCT by those who had the opportunity to enjoy this very special meal.

Cape Cod Roadrunners Winter Fun Run


For the past 30 years, members of the Cape Cod Roadrunners have sponsored a “Fun Run” in January. This year the biggest turnout ever—more than 250 runners—gathered at the Weary Travelers in Monument Beach and set off on the 4.9 mile race course over cold and icy (but not windy) roads. For the second year in a row, Joe Navas won the race. After the race, all runners were treated to warm and hearty seafood chowder and fritters. And all proceeds, \$1,870, were generously donated to the BCT. Thank you Cape Cod Roadrunners!

For the second year, the Cataumet Civic Associates annual Easter Egg Hunt was held at the BCT's Spring Hill Farm. More than 100 kids got to meet (and hug) the Easter bunny, search the fields for candy and the golden egg, and visit with Ben, Peter and Finny (Finny got all dressed up for the occasion). What a happy time at this wonderful farm.



Spring Hill Farm Gets Spiffed Up

Spring Hill Farm was enhanced this year with a split rail fence, a new ramp into the barn, fresh paint on the barn doors and trim and the storage shed and underbrush clearing in the back. Volunteers, the Friends of Spring Hill Farm, feed and care for the animals, put up bird houses and help with general farm clean up and maintenance.

Community Connections Inc. Tours the Farm

Last September a small group from Community Connections in Mashpee visited Spring Hill Farm. This special group of young adults spoiled the goats by feeding them their favorite vines and Finny, the horse, was content with their gentle caresses and hugs.

A Special Gift of Land

In March, Donald H. Angus and Ralph G. Angus donated 19.5 acres of land to the BCT. This generous gift expands on the 14 acres the BCT already owns on the East side of MacArthur Blvd.

Spring Cleaning

At Pocasset Park: In April, the youth of St. John's 7th grade Faith Formation Program cleaned up the Pocasset Village Association Woods. The kids were under the guidance of their teachers Stacey Duberger, Leanne Avakian and Liz Henry.

At the former Cataumet Garden Center: The back acreage of the Cataumet Garden Center where trash had accumulated and stock-piles of shrubs and trees were over abundant has been bush-hogged to rid the area of invasive growth and much of the trash has been removed. While there is still work to be done, it is another step closer to being an inviting spot for a quiet walk or to sit among the flowering trees while enjoying a good book.

At Lawrence Island: On April 25th a group of about 15 members of the Cataumet United Methodist Church cleaned up the shoreline of Squeteague Harbor including Lawrence Island. More than twelve bags of miscellaneous trash were collected and taken to the Bourne Landfill. These generous church volunteers hope to make this an annual project. We hope there will be less trash for them to collect.

Bourne Conservation Trust Trivia Facts & Figures *as of April, 2010*

- ◆ The Bourne Conservation Trust was started 30 years ago in May, 1980.
- ◆ The BCT now owns approximately 240 acres.
- ◆ Of the 240 acres, 112 acres were purchased and 128 acres were donated.
- ◆ The smallest single parcel owned by the BCT is .06 acres (located near the Depot in Cataumet).
- ◆ The largest single parcel owned by the BCT is 33.7 acres (part of the Red Brook Pond Conservation Area).
- ◆ The first piece of land acquired by the BCT was part of DeNormandie Woods, donated in 1980 by Philip DeNormandie and Tina Rathborne.
- ◆ The first land purchased by the BCT was Lawrence Island in 1985 for \$150,000.
- ◆ The most recent acquisition was 19.5 acres East of Macarthur Blvd., donated by Donald H. and Ralph G. Angus.
- ◆ The BCT owns land in most of the villages of Bourne: Cataumet, Pocasset Monument Beach, Bourne Village, Gray Gables and South Sagamore.
- ◆ BCT property includes woodlands, wetlands, fields, ocean frontage, pond frontage, cranberry bog frontage, frontage on the Cape Cod Canal, a railroad depot, and a farm.
- ◆ The BCT has published 44 newsletters.
- ◆ The BCT has 1690 names on its regular mailing list.
- ◆ In 2009, 335 people donated to the BCT. So far, in 2010, 34 people have donated to the BCT.
- ◆ Since the beginning (May 1980), \$5,315,000 has been donated to the BCT.
- ◆ A very conservative estimate of the value of the land owned by the BCT is 11.5 million dollars.
