T Tyler Fields never imagined, when he left the Pacific Northwest to follow his dreams of classic boat-building, that he would end up... feeding goats.

But Tyler is just the most recent in a chain of volunteers and supporters who keep the animals at Spring Hill Farm in Cataumet happy and healthy—by feeding them, cleaning out their pens, and providing them with human attention. Donors and Volunteers Always Needed!

The Trust is most grateful for the yeoman-like labors of the stalwart fellows known as the Trail Meisters, but more volunteers are always appreciated, and not only to maintain properties. NEWS & NOTES

Cataumet Garden Center Update

Good News! There is an agreement in place for the purchase of the remaining lot of land on 28A, at the site of the former Cataumet Garden Center. The expected closing date is August 2012, pending approval of the proposed plan for office space and apartments.

The BCT purchased this land in 2007, preserving 8.5 acres as a nature sanctuary. The remaining 1.5 acres was put up for sale as two business lots.

One lot was sold to Vona Construction, a company that was able to restore the building and enhance the grounds. The house on the remaining lot was torn down in 2011 due to its poor and deteriorating condition. Trees on that property were lost during hurricane Irene and other strong wind storms.

The BCT maintains access to the rear wooded acreage via a path from a small parking area to the left of the commercial property.



A New Trustee Joins the BCT Board of Directors

The BCT welcomes Bill Dibella to the Board of Directors. Bill and his wife Patti moved to Cataumet from Belmont almost three years ago. Prior to the move their summer home was in Sandwich. Early on Bill met Don Mears, a member of the BCT Board and a Trail Meister. Don,

quickly noticing that Bill owned a chainsaw and knew how to use it, recruited him to help out on the trails. Bill, along with the other Trail Meisters, was a player in designing, building and placing all the new BCT signs around town. As for previous work history, Bill retired from Digital Equipment Company and then started a career in real estate that lasted for close to 20 years.

A Beautiful Gift of Land

Special thanks go out to Geert Wijntjes for a gift of six acres of shore frontage, woodlands and wetlands in Pocasset, on Beverly Road, just off Wings Neck Road. This acreage will be left in its natural state for wetlands protection and for preservation by the BCT as a wildlife habitat and nature sanctuary. It houses a well-lived-in osprey nest.

Gifts of land are a win-win for donors and for conservation

organizations like the BCT. Such gifts provide tax advantages and help guarantee the future of special family places or of adjacent lands. They also help preserve the scenic character of an area, maintain air quality and provide a natural habitat for wildlife.



Out on the Trails

Walkers have probably noticed redesigned BCT signs for conservation areas and trails. We think they're handsome and dignified, and hope you do, too.

Courtesy of Tropical Storm Irene in late last August, by early September 2011, BCT Trail Meisters Dick Boyden, Bill Dibella and Don Mears faced unusually massive cleanup chores. The day-long tempest deluged paths with everything from normal late summer debris to over a dozen large fallen trees. Dick warmed up the first Monday by trimming and controlling briar, poison ivy and brush along trails and seating areas near Red Brook Pond. Tuesday Dick raked leaves twigs and branches from Don's house, to the Post Office and RR tracks. On subsequent days, the indefatigable team of Dick, Bill and Don were joined by George Gillis for

the heavy-duty job of lumberjacking shattered oaks and pines ranging up to 15" in diameter. Earning a rest from their labors, they revived with iced tea at Don's house.

Another day, Dick cleaned up blowdowns at Monks Park, Little Bay, Bourne Sisters Woodland and Cataumet Greenway trails east of the railroad tracks. With the heaviest lifting complete, they worked on the fussier but every bit as important task of controlling poison ivy along trails leading to Aptuxcet Trading Post and the Nickerson property.

Owen Sullivan Working towards Eagle Scout

The Boy Scouts of America have been intimately connected and supportive of conservation since their founding over a century ago. Since third grade, fifteen year-old Owen Sullivan of Cataumet has been working his way up from Cub Scout through the levels of Boy Scouts, with a goal of reaching Eagle Scout.

Owen tells how scouting, as in previous generations, teaches boys to appreciate and preserve nature. One Boy Scout motto, "Leave no trace," has worked its way into common parlance after being a longtime guiding principle.

Laboring for conservation is one category of good works for which Scouts gain merit badges leading to promotion. Scouts have built and installed floats in ponds where turtles can perch safely. Scouts have built walkways protecting vulnerable spots on trails.

Owen has worked with

BCT Trail Meister Dick Boyden lopping, limbing, clearing and trimming the popular walking paths in the Trust's Joyce Woods. Mr. Boyden describes Owen as "a quick learner, eager and responsible."

The kids then moved on to say hi to the resident goats, Ben and Pete, and to the Icelandic ponies owned and loaned by Wendy Roth. It was a perfect morning at this wonderful farm.

BCT Land Natural Resource Features

The following is an interesting analysis of land owned by the BCT conducted by Judy Gunter, Principal Investigator and Mark Robinson, Executive Director, both of The Compact of Cape Cod Conservation Trusts, Inc.

Purpose: To map each parcel owned by the BCT and identify its importance in relation to a McHarigian overlay system of natural resource protection attributes. To collate the data to conclude how BCT parcels contribute to significant open space protection in Bourne, Massachusetts.

Summary: According to The Compact's analysis, the BCT has acquired 69 separate parcels (261 acres) in fee simple for open space protection since its founding in 1980. This analysis is limited to those 69 parcels and does not include conservation restrictions and easements held by the BCT.

The BCT property inventory was analyzed for each parcel's attributes and significance relating to a series of natural resource and cultural features. Current data map layers from MassGis and the Cape Cod Commission were overlain with each parcel's boundaries to determine whether the parcel intersected with that layer and therefore held its imputed attributes.

Findings:

81 percent of the parcels (210 acres) lie within the National Heritage and Endangered Species Program boundaries as a habitat for rare species of plants or animals.

65 percent of the parcels (170 acres) share linkage to open space.

61 percent of the parcels (159 acres) are located within a marine recharge area.

52 percent of the parcels (137 acres) contain some wetland.

40 percent of the parcels (105) acres lie within the "BioMap2", which are the most important wildlife habitats in the state.

25 percent of the parcels (66 acres) fall within the Statewide Land Conservation Plan boundaries.

13 percent of the parcels (34 acres) fall within the 100-year floodplain.

13 percent of the parcels (33 acres) are within an Area of Critical Environmental Concern.

6 percent of the parcels (14 acres) lie within Zone 2 or water supply recharge areas.

1 parcel has a certified vernal pool and 1 parcel has a potential vernal pool.

in the small army of volunteers who tend the animals are much appreciated.

The 3.5-acre County Road farm was a gift to the BCT in 2006, from Joan Mayhew, great-granddaughter of Adeline Post, who purchased the farm in 1895. The donation was made in memory of Joan's aunt, Mary B. Scott. Joan, who had moved back to the east coast from California, continued to live on the property until her death in 2007.

Since then, the volunteer corps has been made up of those who either knew Joan, or more recently, those who just want to help.

Phil "Goat Boy" Duddy carries hay and feed from the barn to feed Ben and Peter.



By all accounts, Joan was a colorful character, full of life and humor. Friends and acquaintances alike were blessed with her free-flowing generosity, which led to the housing of both horses and goats at the farm.

One of those early beneficiaries was Bruce Marshard. Though his involvement with the farm predated its being a BCT property, Bruce established a template for helping out at the farm that continues to this day. Bruce lived in the neighborhood and noticed a horse trailer parked near the barn. He approached Joan about using the barn as a place to store hay for his own heavy work horse, and, in exchange for the storage space, built some needed new barn doors.

In May of 1999, Bruce secured Joan's permission to board his new horse Sonny (named after his father) at the farm.

The goats followed shortly, a purchase made to keep Sonny company. Joan named them Ben and Peter. Bruce made a number of improve-



ments to the barn, and built the original goat pen. Soon Bruce added another horse, Max, named after his uncle. Max and Sonny's likenesses adorn the sign on the barn. One of Joan's highlights every year was a horse-drawn carriage trip to Somerset Creamery at the end of the season. Bruce currently lives on Martha's Vineyard, and is still working with horses.

During those years, Joan's neighbor, Phil Duddy, became a good friend and companion. They shared meals, holidays and many cocktail hours. Phil took on goat-feeding duties during his visits and breaks from running the Wood Duck Inn across the street. Their relationship was so close, Joan often referred to him as "my son." In one of the many notes from Joan saved by Phil, she

wrote, "Happy Birthday to very much beloved Phil...the one and only Goat Boy." Phil continues to take care of Ben and Peter, and could arguably be considered Spring Hill Farm's #1 volunteer, spanning the pre- and post-Joan eras.

Joan Richards was another who boarded horses at the farm. With a passion for horses *and* gardening, she maintained both a flower garden—and a human presence—at the farm

when it was no longer owner-occupied. Joan eventually moved on, returning to Martha's Vineyard, where she was raised.

When Tyler Fields came east from Oregon to work with Ballentine's Boat Shop in January of 2011, he became another volunteer to help

with both horses and goats. Working nearby, he stops by to trim the grass, and to make sure the goats have fresh water, and the occasional head scratch.

Jay Fisher and Allison Thompson bought a house in Cataumet in 2007, because of Jay's fond memories of spending many childhood summers there.

They fully intended for it to be their summer home, but when Allison realized she would have the opportunity to work for her employer IBM from home, they moved from Wellesley to live on the Cape full time.

Allison saw an ad in the Cataumet Post Office, calling for volunteers to help on the farm. She started helping with the horses, and Jay cleans out Ben and Peter's pen every other week.

Through Jay and Allison's involvement, their friend Kathy Hickey of the Daily Brew found out more about the farm, and offered to add the fruit and vegetable scraps from

the Brew's kitchen to supplement the goats' pellet diet. The Brew's chief cook, Glenn Corriveau, stops by the farm every day after closing to bring them five to ten gallons of tasty tidbits that would otherwise be thrown away. Ben and Peter are especially fond of pineapple rinds

"The farm is a beautiful piece of property that backs up to cranberry bogs. Nice place to go for a walk, and you can say hi to Ben and Pete. They are pretty friendly, especially to people who feed them. Every once in a while they like to give you a little butt with their heads just to remind you they are goats."






