Trust and Tradition Balanced with Nature

That green and watery region in England's north nurtured naturalists and poets in Wordsworth's time. A century later, Beatrix Potter of the Peter Rabbit stories devoted much of her life and fortune to the National Trust to conserve the Lake District's rural character. To this day the region provides a haven from the hurly-burly elsewhere on that busy island. Cape Cod plays a similar role for the American northeast. In this place, year-rounders marry the sea and sky, and visitors renew their spirits from a world "too much with them."

Trust and Tradition Balanced with Nature

New England nature writer Henry David Thoreau recognized the Cape's distinctive qualities in "Cape Cod," his second most famous book. Myriad Cape poets and naturalists have sung its praises for centuries, and still do.

It's the place named after the North Atlantic's most significant food fish. Cape Cod was among the first regions to be deforested by European settlers. Thoreau noted that the lower Cape was almost treeless by the 1850s. As recently as the 1950s, the upper Cape including Bourne, was a checkerboard of farms and fields resembling regions much farther west. Bourne has enjoyed the distinction of being the Cape town most deeply indented by salt creeks, small islands and meandering peninsulas, or "necks." Despite being bisected by the Cape Cod Canal in 1914 and spanned by bridges and highways between Cape Cod and the mainland, the Town of Bourne retains a pattern of separate, intimate villages. The Four Ponds area in Pocasset is so bucolic, you'd never guess it was once an industrial zone.

Each salt cove seems to host a family-owned boatyard. Sailors recreate all summer on famously reliable breezes. Fishers of shell and gill still ply Bourne's waters and share the bounty with terns and cormorants. Ospreys arrive each spring to breed and fledge their young, before heading south in late summer. The plaintive cries of seagulls are everpresent. Conservationists hope and plan that they always will be.

The Bourne Conservation Trust maintains the upper Cape's version of Boston's Emerald Necklace. Conservation lands offer trails easily accessible for nearby residents that weave through and between villages, from wooded ravines to windy shores. In minutes, walkers can leave dense settlements and busy highways a world away by strolling through the trees.

The BCT has been fortunate, and has planned well, to acquire lands where trees like American beech, hickory, white oak and white pine—rare in some of the Cape's second growth forests—have matured to impressive girths and lofty heights.

Philanthropy established the Bourne Conservation Trust.
Generosity and dedication keep it going, and support is always welcome.
Meanwhile, you can visit unspoiled places, dear hearts by your side, watch herons forage backlit by fire in the sky, and see a fox trot jauntily in search of dinner, thanks to

We Need Your Financial Support.

Cash donations large and small help maintain the BCT's 501(c)(3) status and grow our general funds for present needs and our endowment funds for future needs. Monies in the general fund are used to purchase and maintain properties, as needed. Much as we rely on volunteers, circumstances do arise where we need to hire professional help, for example legal services or professional tree services. These costs, which are also paid out of the general fund, have become significant.

Currently, the BCT has very little debt. This gives us the opportunity to rebuild our cash reserves so that we have funds on hand to meet our obligations. It also enhances our chances to act quickly as new properties become available.

Our fundraising efforts are based on a soft-sell approach, with this newsletter the most important tool. In the newsletter, we list recent donors as a way of saying thank you for your support, and as a way of encouraging others to consider a donation. Donations of any dollar amount are important, because the number of donors shows foundations and other large donors the degree of local support and helps us to retain our status as an IRS 501(c)(3) organization. This status allows your donation to be tax deductible. In other words, please contribute what you can, as often as you can.

Other Ways of Giving

In addition to cash donations, there are many *ways of giving* to the BCT. Here are a few other ways you can support the Trust:

- Name the BCT in your will or as beneficiary of a life insurance policy
- Give appreciated securities
- Give the gift of real estate (or sell it to the BCT for less than its fair market value; the difference is considered a charitable gift). It Works


The BCT approach to fundraising works because our preserved woodlands, shore frontages, marshes and walking trails speak for themselves, and because we are surrounded and supported by people who understand the value and importance of open space, know what our Town might be like without it, and understand that it is everyone's responsibility to protect and maintain it.

Cataumet Greenway Gets Greener

Thanks to your support and generosity, six acres of land that abut the DeNormandie Woods have been purchased and fully paid for by the BCT. This land greatly enhances the Cataumet Greenway and expands the BCT's walking trails and habitat for local wildlife. The purchase and sale agreement was signed last April. Thanks to a matching gift and your donations toward the



purchase of this important piece of property, the BCT was able to raise the funds necessary to cover the full cost without borrowing any money. The purchase is now complete and the land is protected today and for generations to come. This is really good news for the BCT and for all of you who enjoy our trails and the more than 200 acres of open space in our town that has been purchased by or donated to the BCT.

Cataumet Gardens Update

Work is well underway at Cataumet Gardens, located on Route 28A, on



the site of the former Cataumet Garden Center. The developer is Chappy LLC, a local company headquartered in North Falmouth. This new complex, which abuts the 8.5 acres of woodlands preserved by the BCT as a nature sanctuary, will be an upscale, mixed-use complex with retail locations, high-tech office space and luxury one-bedroom apartments in three buildings. A fourth building will house apartments and parking garages. Building one is nearing completion, with some retail tenants expected to open for business around April 1. Ground-breaking for buildings two and three has begun and there is a waiting list for the apartments. The project should be completed later this year. Walk the Trails

If you are looking for a family activity, a peaceful haven away from our busy world, or want to walk the recommended 10,000 steps a day, why not try the BCT trails. There are many to choose from and each is special in its own way. Some go

through woods, others around ponds or along the shore. Oftentimes, it will be just you and the birds, the breezes and perhaps a fox, lots of squirrels or an army of fiddler crabs. In the spring and summer

months there are wildflowers to enjoy. In the winter you may track your footsteps over a light snow cover. You could start with the Cataumet Greenway, made up of these trails:

- Broyer Conservation Area
- Cataumet Depot
- DeNormandie Woods
- Dimmick Waterfront
- John E. Handy Conservation Area
- Jovce Path
- Lawrence Island
- Robinson Conservation Area

You may also want to stroll through the Bourne Sisters Woodland, Little Bay, Red Brook Conservation Area and the Nickerson Conservation Area (by Aptucxet).

Dimmick Family Christmas Tree Sale

Over the years the Dimmick family has created a wonderful holiday tradition well suited to their expansive property on County Road. First, they buy, plant, nurture and prune Christmas trees. Then each year, as the trees mature, families can choose among the trees available for that year, with all proceeds donated to the BCT. Some years, families have had a chance to take a tractor ride to choose their tree, watch it being cut and then brought back to their car on a trailer. A cup of hot cider in the Dimmick barn can be an added treat. The BCT sends a big thanks to the Dimmick family for their ongoing support.

Cape Cod Road Runners "Winter Fun Run"

The 33rd and 34th runnings of the annual Winter Fun Run, sponsored by Cape Cod Road Runners, were held in January, 2014 and 2015. The course is 4.9 miles, on paved roads and a somewhat hilly terrain. The

race starts and ends at the Weary Travelers Club in Monument Beach. The race always starts at 10:30 am...rain, snow or shine. There are awards for all ages, from juniors under age 20 to super seniors age 70 and older. Typically, 200 to

220 people race to the finish line with times that range from just over 26 minutes to 90 minutes. The reward for participating: clam fritters, seafood chowder, a cold "drink" plus a pair of the popular cotton running gloves. There is also a raffle. All proceeds from the run are donated to the BCT to help in its efforts to purchase land for conservation. OUT on the TRAILS

Do you ever notice, when you walk the BCT trails, that they are remarkably well-maintained and well-signed? This does not happen by chance. It is a true team effort. Whether it was cleaning up after Hurricane Sandy, last winter's late heavy snowfall, or a fall nor'easter, a small group of volunteers, we call them Trail Meisters, work hard to make your walking experience on the BCT trails a good one most every day of the year. Path) adjacent to the Old Penn Central Railroad. In 1970, prior to the formation of the BCT, Therese supported her husband as he obtained signatures on a petition requesting the Town of Bourne to designate a 12-acre parcel of land on Depot Road as conservation land, to be called the Broyer Conservation Land in memory and honor of Clifton Lee Broyer, killed in action in Vietnam.

Therese was active in the Cataumet community for almost fifty years, loved by her family and neighbors, and remembered for her kindness, straightforwardness and humor. She will be missed.
